# Gorley Vale Riding Club Newsletter August 2023


I hope you are all enjoying our wonderful Summer weather! However, our members are a stoic lot and we haven't let the rain stop us from making the most of the varied events on offer...



#### Stuff that's happened...


Saturday 3<sup>rd</sup> June - Ridden Clinic with Franklin Balls, Wick Farm, Downton
Believe it or not, the sun was actually shining for this event! Our members learnt how Pilates on
horseback could improve their posture, build a connection to their horse and build confidence. Sandra
definitely enjoyed the session and reports as follows:

"We all had fun using our core and balance, whilst using bands and Franklin balls! Sounds fun you say - it was:) Anna explained at the start how we could use each item, either by placing them under your rider seat - to improve a deep seat, or around your wrist - to keep those hands still. We found this one very tricky and it felt like we didn't have any control. It did however make you aware of how you move your hands around, for me, far too much! There was also a longer band, that you position around your body to link up with your hands and reins - this enables you to sit up in a good rider position, again keeping your hands balanced.



We were then able to have a go freely, guided by Anna. Our group all went in to the arena saying we will not be cantering but, by using these tools, it gave us all the confidence and good position to encourage our equines to canter by the end of the session. We all had lots of fun."

Thank you Sandra for organising such an interesting clinic – definitely one I would like to have a go at in the future!
